 No more waiting for items! hoopla is a service that allows you to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics, and TV shows to enjoy on your computer, tablet, phone, or TV. You can stream titles immediately through your desktop browser or our mobile app (on the app, you can also download titles to your mobile devices to enjoy offline). We have hundreds of thousands of titles to choose from, with more being added daily. Please call us if you have any questions or issues.

## Clymer Offers These Services!

The library is not only about books... take advantage of these wonderful services!



### Free Wi-Fi

Use our free Wi-Fi in the library. Ask for the network name and password at the circulation desk.

### Public Desktop PCs



You may use one of eight HP desktop PCs. Each has Windows 10 and Chrome, Firefox, and Edge, plus applications including Microsoft Office 2016 Professional (Word, Excel, Powerpoint, Publisher, Access, etc.).

### Use a Chromebook



You may use a Chromebook provided by the library. Chromebooks are small, basic laptops that use Google's Chrome OS. They can print and browse the web. NOTE: for in-library use only.

### Print a Document/Image



Print in black and white or color using one of our desktop computers or laptops/Chromebooks for public use, or use your mobile device or laptop. You may print in letter or legal size. Ask for the prices of printing at the front desk.

### Make Copies



You may make copies on our machine. It can copy black and white, color, double sided, letter, legal, and more. Ask for prices of printing at the front desk.

### Send a Fax/Receive a Fax



You may send a fax from the library at \$1.00 per page. We can also provide a cover page for free. You may also receive a fax, also for \$1.00 per page. We ask that you call ahead before sending a fax to the library. Our fax # is (570) 646-6181.

### Scan to USB



Plug a USB flash drive into our copier and scan a document into it as a PDF. NOTE: the machine is not Internet-connected, so it cannot be scanned into email.

### Read the Newspaper



We have a daily delivery of the *Pocono Record* and *New York Times*. Enjoy the comfortable couches and catch up on the day's events. We typically keep a week's back stock of these papers until Saturday.
